Background Information:				
Monies in this year's budget were increased to account for a new EPA emission requirement that has caused a 2.7% increase in building costs of the upcoming Pumper Truck. This increase has resulted in an addition of \$17,213 per year in costs (total increase of \$34,426). The previous firetruck is a 1999 model, exhibiting rusting, and increased maintenance costs leading to the necessity of replacement within the next few years. All three payments have and will be made utilizing BuyBoard pricing to Metro Fire Apparatus Specialists, Inc. in the amount of \$432,751.50 for the second installment and \$432,751.50 for the third installment in FY '26-27. Total cost of the replacement Pumper will be \$1,281,042.

Cancellation Terms

Due to market conditions, a cancellation policy is in effect and terms are as follows:

In the event this proposal is accepted, and a purchase order issued then cancelled or terminated by the Customer before completion, Metro Fire will add a cancellation fee. The following charge schedule based on costs incurred will be applied.

- A) 10% of the purchase price after the order is placed.
- B) 20% of the purchase price after completion of the approval drawings and pre-construction.
- C) 30% of the purchase price upon any material requisition.
- D) 60% of the purchase price once the apparatus has begun manufacturing.


