Happy Thanksgiving, Merry Christmas, and a Happy New Year!






# **Understanding the FY2023 Budget**

#### **Friendly Reminder from Animal Control**




Make sure your pets have a warm place to sleep, off the floor and away from all drafts. A cozy dog or cat bed with a warm blanket or pillow is a perfect way to keep them warm. Remember, if it's too cold for you outside, it's probably too cold for your pet to be outside. So, please keep your animals inside when the temperatures drop in the winter. Also, when it comes to chemicals in the garage, like antifreeze, assume any spills are highly toxic and even a few licks or walking through the fluid can be deadly. Other potentially dangerous items include windshield washing fluid and ice melt products that can cause gastrointestinal tract irritation, depression, weakness, seizures, cardiac issues, and other life-threatening issues.

#### **Holiday Safety Tips from WPSD**

Public Safety Director Chief Crook wants to remind citizens of some helpful tips to stay safe during the upcoming holidays!



- Place Christmas trees, candles, and other holiday decorations at least three feet away from heat sources like fireplaces, portable heaters, radiators, heat vents, and candles.
- Purchase flame retardant metallic or artificial trees. If you purchase a real tree, make sure that it has fresh, green needles that aren't easily broken. Keep live trees as moist as possible by giving them plenty of water. Use only sturdy tree stands designed not to tip over. Keep curious pets and children away from Christmas trees.
- Always unplug tree and holiday lights before leaving home or going to bed. Never use lit candles to decorate a tree.
- Always extinguish candles before leaving the room or going to bed. Designate one person to walk around your home to make sure that all candles and smoking materials are properly extinguished after guests leave.
- Keep a properly charged fire extinguisher readily available.
