City Update from Mayor Amine Qourzal

Dear Woodway Residents,

Summer is here, and the Qourzal family has been enjoying all the fun Woodway has to offer! There are plenty of things to do, from movie nights and concerts to visits to the Arboretum and indoor activities at the Family Center. Make sure to stay updated on all of the events and projects by following all the city's social media pages and website, and come enjoy with us!

Summer is also a great time to get a mid-year update on key projects happening in our city, and I wanted to share some of those with you:

Fairway Sewer Phase 3: Despite weather delays, we aim to complete the main sewer line between Brookwood Dr. and Jimmark Dr. by the end of February next year.

2" Water Line Replacement: The water line work is now completed, and we will have fresh asphalt and repaired streets by the end of June. We are also making great progress with the Ritchie Road line installation and anticipate a completion date around the end of October.

Bosque and US 84 Ground Storage Tank Rehabilitation: Both tanks are expected to be in top condition by the end of November.

Wood Valley Dr. and Whitehall Park Parking Lot Improvements: We expect to have substantial completion by early July.

2024 Street Microseal Project: This project is set to start in July, bringing improvements to various streets. The schedule will be posted on the city website.

Estates Dr. and Fairway Rd. Bicycle/Pedestrian Lanes: Bidding will take place this summer, with work starting in the fall.

Thank you for your patience and support. Together, we're building a stronger and more vibrant city. Stay safe, enjoy the sunshine, and let's make it a great summer in Woodway!

A Note from the WPSD Animal Control Officer

Control mosquitoes outdoors

- **Once a week**, empty or throw out any items that hold water like vases and flowerpot saucers.
- Tightly cover water storage containers (buckets, rain barrels, etc.)
- For containers without lids, use mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.
- Use larvicides to treat large containers of water that will not be used for drinking and cannot be covered or dumped out.
- Use an outdoor insect spray in dark humid areas where mosquitoes rest, like under patio furniture or in the carpet or garage. Always follow label instructions.
- If you have a septic tank, repair cracks or gaps. Cover vent or plumbing pipe openings using mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.

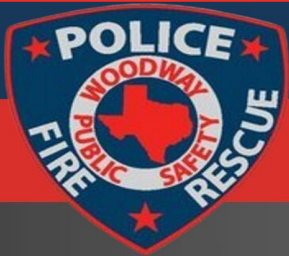

Woodway Code of Ordinances
Sec. 11-1. - Grass, weeds and brush as public nuisance.

Any and all owners, lessees, occupants or any other persons in charge of any premises in the city shall not allow grass, weeds or brush to grow upon the premises to such an extent as to become a health or fire hazard or to a height in excess of twelve (12) inches in any location thereon. Any and all owners, lessees, occupants or persons in charge of premises with a sidewalk or parkway abutting thereon shall not allow such sidewalk or parkway to have grass, weeds or brush accumulated thereon to such an extent as to become a health or fire hazard or to a height in excess of twelve (12) inches in any location thereon. For purposes of this chapter, ornamental shrubs and plants shall not be considered as brush. Any violation of this section is declared to constitute a public nuisance and subject to the remedial and penalty provisions hereafter set out.

Woodway Code of Ordinances

Sec. 7-4. - Bundled trash and brush for residential collection.
In the event that trash is of such a nature that it cannot be placed in approved containers, it shall be placed in bundles or disposable containers having no outside dimension of more than four (4) feet and shall be placed for collection as provided in section 7-3 hereof. Brush shall be cut in lengths not to exceed four (4) feet and shall be trimmed and stacked at curbside or alley to a height of not more than three (3) feet, with larger ends placed toward the curb or alley. All vines and thorny bushes shall be placed in disposable containers. No bundle, container or other item shall weigh in excess of fifty (50) pounds.
