

ATTENTION!!

In an effort to protect the citizens of Woodway, The Woodway Police Department would like to inform you of an increase in scams targeting the elderly. These scams can take on many forms. They often include a transfer of funds in some way. As a reminder you should never provide personal information to someone over the phone especially if they have reached out to you claiming to have an official capacity that you have no affiliation with. Never answer personal questions to an individual who has contacted you. Never utilize numbers, emails, or other ways of contacting an entity provided to you by an individual for validation of who they are. They will try to have you validate information through a source they provide. This person is often also involved.

The following are some indicators of fraud:

- -Buying prepaid gift cards.
- -Purchasing and transferring bitcoin.
- -Sending checks, money orders, or cash.
- -Receiving large sums of money and then making a withdrawal.
- -Suspicious refunds to you then returning cash you withdraw.
- -Purchasing gold as payment.
- -Technical support scams.
- -Someone claiming to be an attorney representing an arrested family member.
- -Claiming to be law enforcement collecting fees for outstanding warrants.
- -Claims to be law enforcement requesting you assist in catching other committing crimes.
- -Suspicious emails that look like ones you have been communicating with especially when discussing payments.
- -Letting someone remote into your computer via am email.
- -Claiming they are monitoring hackers watching your device.
- -Messages claiming you have unpaid toll tags.

We encourage you to contact the Woodway Police Department with questions or concerns. We would rather speak to you before you have been victimized by one of these scams and keep your hard-earned assets.



Answering Your Frequently Asked City Maintenance Questions



Solving the Marking Mystery!

One source of frequent speculation and curiosity is the marking of utility lines with paint or flags. Who makes these marks and why? What do all of those colors mean, and is it really necessary? Let's solve the marking mystery!

Taking the last question first, yes, it really is necessary to make those marks. In fact, it is the law, not only for the City of Woodway but for every resident, business, contractor, or city crew who performs digging work as part of a project. The <u>Texas One-Call Law</u>, found in Chapter 251 of the Texas Utilities Code, mandates the notification of utility companies for any digging or ground disturbance of 16 inches or deeper.

The Texas One-Call Law is named because the state has created a free system that allows excavators to notify all applicable utilities with just one call to 811, or by using the online portal at Texas811.org. For planned digging, excavators must use one of these two methods to request the marking of utilities at least 48 hours in advance, excluding weekends and holidays. In cases of emergency, defined by dangers to life, health, or property, the excavator may proceed with extreme caution. It is still highly recommended to call prior to digging and identify the situation as an emergency but, if work proceeds prior to marking, the excavator must still notify 811 as soon as reasonably possible.

At the heart of all this regulation is safety – the safety of people, the property, and the services they depend on every day. The expenses and inconvenience of repairing accidental damage can add up, and excavators who damage a clearly marked line or do not call for location may find themselves footing the bill and paying costly fines. Worse, underground gas and electrical lines could pose a risk much greater than inconvenience if they were hit by an unsuspecting excavator. With an ever-evolving spider web of underground utilities in easements and rights-of-way across the state, marking utilities is the best way to prevent damage, but it is the responsibility of every excavator to dig with care regardless of the markings!



Solving the Marking Mystery! (continued)

So, what do all those marks actually mean?



Within the City of Woodway, our Public Utilities crews will be notified by 811 to mark the main water or sewer lines (BLUE or GREEN). However, as the lines from your house to the water and sewer mains were installed on private property by plumbing contractors, City staff are unable to locate and mark these lines. We are also unable to mark private irrigation lines. These are typically located, when necessary, by a plumbing or irrigation contractor.

If you have questions about utility locates, or about markings in your area, please feel free to contact the Community Services and Development department at (254) 772-4050.

If you have a digging project on your property, remember to call 811 or visit <u>Texas811.org</u> to request utility locates. The service is free, and digging without locates just is not worth the risk!





Important Reminders from Your Public Safety Department



CITY OF WOODWAY CODE ENFORCEMENT IS GEARING UP TO START ENFORCING CITY ORDINANCES CONCERNING PARKING, MOWING, JUNK VEHICLES, RUBBISH AND MORE...

You may already be aware of most City Ordinances; however, we wanted to reach out first and make sure everyone is informed so that you are not confused if the Code Enforcement Officer or a City of Woodway Police Officer comes by to visit or gives you a notice of a violation/citation.

Here are some primary Ordinances to remember and please follow:

- You cannot store rubbish, junk, trash, debris, or discarded items
 and equipment on your property for more than 72 hours and
 when it is visible from a public street/alley. Rubbish includes
 decayed lumber, unusable decayed structures, rubble, stone
 fragments of building materials, mounds of dirt or rock, and
 other similar materials. Trash can include unused, abandoned, or
 materials not resistant to damage or deterioration from
 exposure to the outside environment. (Ch. 7)
- It is illegal to park trailers or other non-motorized equipment on city streets or alleys. (Ch. 10)

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT FIRE SAFETY THIS SUMMER

Fire damage has been making a lot of headlines lately. Here are some fire safety tips to keep in mind as the weather heats up:

1.INSTALL SMOKE ALARMS:

 Place smoke detectors on every level of your home, especially near sleeping areas. Test them monthly and replace the batteries yearly.

2. KNOW YOUR EXITS:

 Plan and practice at least two escape routes from every room or area. Keep exits clear of clutter.

3. STAY LOW IN SMOKE:

 If escaping a fire, crawl under smoke to avoid inhaling toxic fumes - heat and gases rise.

4. USE FIRE EXTINGUISHERS WISELY:

- Keep a multipurpose extinguisher (rated for A, B, and C fires) accessible.
- Learn the PASS technique:
 - Pull the pin.
 - Aim at the base of the fire.
 - Squeeze the handle.
 - Sweep side to side.

5. HANDLE FLAMMABLES CAREFULLY:

 Store gasoline, paint, or other flammable materials in approved containers, away from heat sources like stoves or heaters.

6. COOK SAFELY:

Never leave cooking unattended, especially with oil or grease.
 Keep a lid nearby to smother small stovetop fires.

7. CANDLE CAUTION

 Keep candles away from curtains, papers, or anything that burns. Extinguish them before leaving the room or going to sleep.

8. ELECTRICAL SAFETY:

 Avoid overloading outlets and replace frayed cords or damaged plugs. Unplug appliances when not in use.

9. AVOID RISKY OUTDOOR CONDITIONS:

 Do not start a fire on windy or excessively dry days - sparks can travel far and ignite dry vegetation.

10. MIND EQUIPMENT:

 Sparks from chainsaws, ATVs, or other machinery can start fires. Use spark arrestors and avoid operating in dry, grassy areas

11. REPORT FIRES EARLY:

 If you spot an uncontrolled fire, call emergency services immediately and provide the exact location.

Your vigilance can prevent unnecessary loss of life and property!




Making History: Celebrating 70 Years
